<p><b>Crewkerne &amp; Ilminster Schools Partnership (CISP):</b> Contribution towards partnership co-ordinator, providing PE CPD for our subject leader and access to a number of local sports festivals and activities</p>	£278.00	<p>Children have and will continue to have access to festivals at local schools and inter-school competitions. Taking part in local sports activities between local CISP schools gives children an opportunity to take part in a range of sports in different contexts.</p> <p>CPD meetings and training have taken place for local PE leaders.</p>
<p><b>Purchase of additional PE resources</b> New goals and other resources to enhance P.E lessons, playtimes and after school clubs, including running bibs, balls, playground games, boccia sets, and athletics equipment.</p>	£3145.00	<p>This enables children to have continued access to high quality sporting equipment at playtimes, during P.E lessons and during after school clubs.</p> <p>Children are able to represent the school at sporting fixtures and wear their new football kits with pride.</p>
<p><b>Specialist P.E coaching for P.E sessions and after school clubs</b> A variety of after school clubs run by Pro-coaching</p>	£3575.00	<p>Through the provision of qualified sports coaches to deliver P.E lessons, the quality and breadth of teaching and learning in this area has improved. Pupils are able to access a range of sports and are participating in regular physical activity. In addition, school staff are shadowing/observing these lessons to develop their own skills in this area.</p>
<p><b>Costs for teaching assistant support at after school clubs</b></p>	£2390.00	<p>The number of children attending sports clubs has continued to rise and almost all children are attending a sports club during the year. The teaching assistant support has enabled all children to access after school sports clubs.</p>
<p><b>Transport costs to sporting events</b> We attend various sports festivals within our local school sports cluster groups</p>	£1325.00	<p>Taking part in local sports activities between local schools gives children an opportunity to take part in a range of sports in different contexts. This year, children have also taken part in cricketing activities out of the local area.</p>
<p><b>Hire of sporting venue</b></p>	£130.00	<p>This has enabled children to try a range of sports, including gymnastics, which the school is unable to provide due to limited space in the school hall.</p>
<p><b>Forest school</b> Costs for forest school leaders to run regular sessions for each class</p>	£930.00	<p>Forest school has a positive impact on children's self-esteem, which in turn impacts positively on their emotional health. Forest school sessions also give children the</p>

		opportunity to be active and challenge themselves both physically and emotionally through physical activities and risk taking.
<b>Part-funding of ELSA training and sessions</b> A member of staff to continue to develop through ELSA training to support children with their emotional well-being	£569.00	ELSA sessions will support children with their emotional well-being and will in turn have a positive impact on their physical health and well-being.
<b>Resources for additional outdoor space</b> Resources to be used in the outdoor shelter (Pod) during playtimes for structured playground games; and also for use in ELSA and nurture sessions	£719.00	These resources will enable children to have access to alternative games at playtimes. This provides another quality outdoor space for playtimes, ELSA sessions, social interventions, nurture and mindfulness which will impact positively on children's emotional and physical health.
<b>Contribution towards upkeep of play equipment in playground and P.E equipment</b>	£386.00	This enables children to improve their upper body strength and dexterity through play. It encourages children to be more active and improves social interactions and enjoyment of playtimes.
<b>Purchase of two Ipads</b> Ipads to be used during P.E sessions and after-school clubs to review/improve skills and techniques, including gymnastics/dance routines (country dancing)	£480.00	This will enable children to film themselves and each other during P.E sessions to review and improve their skills and techniques. This will be particularly beneficial in gymnastics and dance sessions to critique and improve routines and skills.
<b>Specialist yoga teaching</b> Weekly yoga sessions throughout the spring and summer term	£1085.00	Through the provision of a qualified yoga teacher, the children have access to high quality yoga sessions. This will impact on their physical and mental health and well-being.
<b>Hosting a whole school games day</b> A day that gives all children across the school the opportunity to develop their cricket skills	£329.00	This will be an opportunity for children to be taught by qualified coaches and develop their cricket skills. This will be part of our offer for the Bronze School Games Mark.
