Homework Menu

Please select AT LEAST 1 activity from the following activities to do as your home work this term. They will link in to our learning at school.

(Reception children):

- Go outside for a walk and use your senses. Make a list or draw pictures of the things you see, hear, smell and touch on your walk.
- Think of a journey that you make regularly. This could be a journey to school or a trip to the shops. Talk about all the places you pass. Draw a map to show the route you take and the places you see along the way.
- Talk about the places you like to visit in your local community. Draw your favourite place and explain why it is good to visit.
- Choose a place to go for a picnic and make a list of the food you will take. Add a photograph of you enjoying your picnic.

Movers and Shakers (Year 1 and 2):

- Choose five famous people and find out about their impact on the world. Can you rank them from who you think is the most to the least significant?
- Write a short biography about a historically significant person who lived in the past. It can be someone that you have learned about in class, or it could be someone who lived in your local area. Write about the person's life and why we remember them today. Use information books and the internet to help you to find information and pictures to include. Share your biography with someone in your family.
- Hunt around your house and in your local area for memorials that celebrate the lives and achievements of significant people. Examples could include coins, stamps, statues and road names. Take photographs of any that you find and share them with the class.
- Historically significant people can be divided into five different groups. These include activists, artists, explorers, monarchs and scientists. Write a definition to explain what each group does.
- Pick a significant person, maybe one that you have learnt about in class, and draw or paint a portrait of that person.
- Make a map of a journey that a famous explorer has made. Maybe you could pick Christopher Colombus, Ernest Shackleton, Neil Armstrong or Edmund Hilary.
- Pick a famous artist whose art you think is good and try to recreate their picture using your own style.

Reception children to attempt to do at least one activity.

Year 1 and 2 to do at least 2.
